

## Dawlish World War One project

Organisations in Dawlish have joined to commemorate the sacrifice of those who went to war and did not return. The aim is to build a record of the impact of the War on families, the life of the town and, of course, the story of those who went to war, and of the many who did not return. We include the civil parish of Dawlish, so that names of those recorded on memorials at Cofton and Holcombe appear here too, as well as those who are buried in the town cemetery but may not find a place on the town War Memorial.

We have attempted to find the names of all of those who became casualties of war from the civil parish, and we are very keen to make contact with descendants to join us in simple services of Commemoration that will take place on the centenary of each death.

We are gathering, from public sources, information about each person, and this may be of value to those preparing their family histories. We will be very happy to copy photographs to accompany the histories.

In 1914 there was excitement at the outbreak of war, assuming that it would all be over by Christmas. Hopes were soon dashed as reports came of the losses at the battlefront. The Navy was shocked at the loss of 1,600 men at the Battle of Coronel on November 1<sup>st</sup>, when three sailors from Dawlish were among those lost. Worse was to come in 1915 when nine Dawlish soldiers, members of the Devonshire Regiment, were killed in action on one day, 25<sup>th</sup> September 1915, at the battle of Loos. The news brought great misery to the families involved. Five sailors from Dawlish died in ships at the Battle of Jutland on 31<sup>st</sup> May, 1916.

This booklet has been prepared to begin to show the impact of the news of casualties on those left behind in Dawlish. The Dawlish Gazette of the period carried letters from those involved and a careful search of their reports will reveal insights into the experiences at the front, through the letters exchanged between the families at home and those in the field of action.

Visual information will be added from the valuable Dawlish Archive of photographs, being restored and indexed.

The project group will be glad to see any material that local families can bring forward for loan to the project. Any information or material can be brought to Dawlish Library or Dawlish Museum. All items will be handled with great care and returned to the owners.

The project is revealing the absence of names from the town War Memorial and will lead to consideration of whether the War Memorial should have other names added to it. Equally, the Devon Roll of Honour, prepared soon after the end of the War, may have further information added to it as a result of this project's research.

The sections which follow give a brief account of each casualty during the first year of War. Each year, further names will added, until there is a full account of Dawlish's contribution to the War.
