Born 1894 Wellington (Williton?), Somerset


Married 1909 Ellen Susan Millman at St Thomas the Martyr, Exeter

### Buried Heudicourt Communal Cemetery - Somme

Heudicourt is a village in the north-western corner of the Department of the Somme, 13 kilometres north-east of Peronne and 17 kilommetres south-west of Cambrai.

The COMMUNAL CEMETERY EXTENSION was begun at the end of March 1917 and and used by fighting units until March 1918.

The extension contains 85 Commonwealth burials of the First World War.
