Private Thomas Alfred Smith 13th January 1917

We regret to hear of the death of another of the Devon lads at the front, viz., Pte Thomas Alfred Smith, of "Buller's-Own," whose wife is a daughter of Mr and Mrs John Lambshead, of 3 Old Town Street, Dawlish. The widow, who has been living in Dawlish of late with her three children, aged 7, 6 and 2 respectively, received a letter from one of the nurses at a base hospital, dated the 9th inst., stating that her husband was seriously ill with bloodpoisoning. Following quickly on this letter came a telegram conveying the sad news of his death on the 13th inst. She has since received a letter, dated the 13th, stating that her husband was very much worse and unconscious. Deceased, before joining up, was for some years in the Naval College at Dartmouth as a Cadet's servant. Many years ago he was employed on railway extension works at Dawlish. The greatest sym-pathy will be felt with the widow and the three little children.

Since writing the above we are informed that the widow gave birth to another child, a boy, at mid-day on Thursday.
