ROLL OF HONOUR.

The war has cut short the life of a specially promising young Dawlish man in the person of Pte Arthur John Moore, of the Coldstream Guards, who was killed in an attack made on the 27th of August. Deceased was the youngest son of the late Mr David Moore, and of Mrs Moore, Brunswick Place, Dawlish, and was aged 32. He went to the front on December 27th of last year. Since a lad and up to the time of joining the Army he had been employed as a Clerk at the office of Messrs Whidborne and Cole, solicitors. Of a studious and conscientious nature, he spared no pains in making himself thoroughly conversant with the details of the work that fell to him.

For some years he attended to, and was thoroughly *au fait* with the Council work, and after the outbreak of hostilities was specially valuable to his employer by reason of his mastery of the intricacies of the Military Service Acts and other matters arising out of the war. He was a thorough gentleman in manner and ways, ever ready to put himself out to do an obliging act, and those who knew him deeply deplore his death.
